The Tent by Donald Lipski


Commissioned by the Indy 500 Festival in 2008, this sculpture is a gift to the city commemorating their 50th anniversary. The wind activated tower has nearly 500 hinged flags in an array of colors. The movement of the wind and colored panels imitates the view of the crowd from the drivers seat of an Indy car during the 500 mile race.

<u>Yellow Butterfly by James Havens</u>

Yellow Butterfly exudes simplicity. James Havens creates his work with the artistic philosophy that ""less is more". inspired by nature, Havens designed this sculpture to stand alone with minimal explanation, as he intends for all his pieces. Havens serves as an artistic welding instructor at Owens Community College in Toledo, Ohio. He also owns and operates The Rose Bronze Foundry and Havens Studio.

Prime Commonality by Luke Crawley & Quincy Owens
The ancestral commonality between humans and
chimpanzees is undeniable, with dramatic evidence
exhibited in our chromosomal similarities. Prime
Commonality is visually inspired by the Hugh degree of
correlation as shown in human and chimpanzee

chromosomal banding patterns.

VOLUNTEERS

White River State Park hosts over 400 volunteers annually from mid-April to mid-October. Volunteer sessions are available for sign up to groups of 5 or more between the hours of 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday thru Friday. All volunteer work at the Park is outdoors, maintenance focused, and moderately physical.

The Urban Wilderness Trail

The Park's volunteer efforts a mainly focused on the upkeep of the southern most portion of the Urban Wilderness Trail, though some groups may assist Park maintenance. The UWT is a protected native wildlife habitat on the east bank of the White River, monarch butterfly sanctuary, Indiana Bat research site, and cross country trail.
